Initial Mini CoIIN (PDSAs) Plans

- ✧ Original Plan: Ohio Farm to ECE needs assessment
- ✧ How do you think the CoIIN or PDSAs method changed your plan or your process?
 - ✧ Led us to doing a trial, creating Farm to ECE training and expanding CoIIN team



Needs Assessment Takeaways

- ✧ Over 82% already doing Farm to ECE or plan to start
- ✧ 76.99% of providers serve local produce and 35% serve local 8 or more times per year
- ✧ Almost 19% don't define local or don't know how to define local
- ✧ Largest barrier is cost/funding and seasonality
- ✧ Online self-paced modules are preferred



2020 plan and PDSAs Impact
